IT It has a bone.	ITS Its bone is old.
WE We have a bird.	OUR Our bird is noisy.
YOU You have a house.	YOUR Your house is big.
THEY They have a car.	THEIR Their car is slow.

YOUR = Possessive Adjective

YOU'RE = You are (contraction)
- You're an excellent student.

ITS = Possessive Adjective
- The dog played with its ball.

IT'S = It is (contraction)
- It's very hot right now.

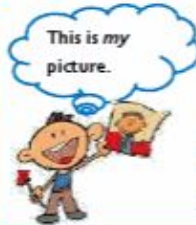

- > We use possessive adjectives to tell to whom something belongs. When something belongs to a man/boy we use **his**.
→ Pete finished **his** homework.
- > Use **her** when something belongs to woman/girl.
→ Mary is talking to **her** mother.
- > Use **its** when something belongs to singular things/animals.
The cat scratched the child with **its** claws.
- > **Your** is used when things belong to the addressed person/s.
→ Bob! Where are you? I hear **your** voice but can't see you.
- > Use **our** when something belongs to the speakers.
→ Our house is very big.
- > **Their** is used when something belongs to a group of people, animals or things.
→ The children went to **their** school.
- > Possessive adjectives are always followed by nouns.
→ **My** shoes are new.
